

Procedure for bringing goats into Oregon from other states:

- Scrapie Identification Tag: Can be an ear tag, a tattoo, or a microchip—some type of permanent identification associated with Scrapie. Determine which of the approved ear tags or other approved ID systems will work best for you. For more information call toll-free 1-866-USDA-TAG (873-2824)
- contact your local APHIS Veterinary Services office and obtain a flock ID number. You can request tags from them.
- Alternatively, contact your local vet & let them know that you need Scrapie ID tags. Many vets provide them.
- Get a health certificate from an accredited veterinarian prior to interstate shipment or sale into interstate commerce of animals for breeding or exhibition. **NOTE: Must be done 30 days or LESS before the Rendezvous Event.**
- Tag the goats before they leave your premises (or have your vet tattoo or microchip them).
- 14 DAYS PRIOR to the event: Have your vet call the Oregon Department of Animal Health to request an IMPORT PERMIT. **PERMITS are only good for 14 DAYS.**

AGAIN: Health certificates from accredited veterinarians are ONLY GOOD FOR 30 DAYS! Import Permits are ONLY GOOD for 14 Days! Plan accordingly!
